These efforts reflect our unwavering commitment to economic recovery in Greece – a mission we pursue with a renewed sense of urgency in the face of the ongoing challenges brought on by prolonged austerity measures and the impact of the 2020 pandemic.





HOPEgenesis, founded in 2015, is a Greek non-profit organization dedicated to reversing Greece's declining birth rates by supporting families, especially in remote and underserved regions. Active in over 350 areas, including 40 islands, the organization collaborates with 27 medical centers and over 80 healthcare professionals to provide comprehensive care, from prenatal exams to transport and accommodation.

The End of Year Appeal aimed at raising funds dedicated to providing food relief for families under severe economic hardship as a consequence of the recent energy crisis that has led a number of individuals & families seeking for assistance from social welfare organizations and government aid agencies.

Following the Joint Fundraising Appeal organized by THI Australia & THI Canada during the holiday season the amount of €13.235,52 was raised and transferred to Desmos.

The amount of €11.845,80 was allocated towards covering the needs of the two Social Groceries and €1.389,72 were allocated for Desmos' administrative cost & taxes.

The Social Grocery of Salamina and the Social Grocery of Thermo Aitoloakarnania were selected assisting more than 400 families with food packages containing basic products, covering their needs for a two month period.



I am so grateful I had someone to talk to, and get advice from. It was a great gift for me at a difficult time, where I was feeling lonely and needed to have someone outside from my own circle to listen to me, so I could also listen to myself and my needs. I really enjoyed the time I shared with the psychologist and the conversations we had, it helped me see another perspective, it empowered me at times when I felt low

and it was very helpful"

sessions with the psychologist, my son was going through a divorce and I was hosting him and my grandson for many months. This had been very difficult for me practically and psychologically. Having no space and time for myself in my own home and constantly feeling worried for both my son and grandson made me very stressed. It was difficult for them too...a lot of changes in their lives. I really needed the time I had with the psychologist. It helped me offload and have some private space, my 'alone-time', a time where I could focus on myself and talk about how I feel. It really helped me and I was always looking forward to each session."

It was very helpful for me to have that time with the psychologist and feel that she was there for me in a very professional and supportive manner."



Net Zero Energy Care Project

The "Net Zero Energy Care" project in Thessaloniki, Greece was successfully completed. This initiative, led by TIMA Charitable Foundation and INZEB, with support from THI Canada and other foundations, aims to transform elderly care homes into net-zero-energy facilities. By upgrading insulation, windows, and HVAC systems, the project has already reduced energy demand and CO₂ emissions. With future plans to install photovoltaic panels, this model demonstrates how sustainable practices can cut energy costs and improve living conditions for vulnerable populations.

The project's impact extends beyond energy savings, supporting better quality of care, improved health outcomes, and environmental responsibility in line with EU climate goals. This effort paves the way for similar transformations in non-profit care facilities, underscoring the potential for long-term sustainability and enhanced wellbeing.



ReGeneration Greece

In partnership with THI US, THI Canada supported ReGeneration Greece by funding 53% of staff salaries with a \$25,000 contribution. ReGeneration is Greece's largest post-graduate training and job placement program, established by THI US and Coca-Cola. Since 2014, it has provided over 800,000 training hours, placed more than 3,700 graduates in jobs, and partnered with over 2,000 companies. By raising awareness for THI Canada's Scholarship Program through its platforms, ReGeneration aligns with THI Canada's mandate to advance education and training.

Accelerate Greece Program

Accelerate Greece is an elite accelerator program designed to drive Greek innovation by empowering entrepreneurs to build successful tech companies. Selected startups engage in immersive workshops, mentorship, networking with 20+ industry leaders, and investor introductions. This year's program also granted access to the Elevate Festival, providing a unique platform for global exposure.

The program is fully funded, covering airfare and hotel costs, with no fees for application or participation. Only three companies are selected each year, ensuring a highly focused experience for participants.



The Hellenic Initiative (US), THI Canada, and Ergo Capital selected three startups—Grandmama, ManaGi, and TPL—for the 2024 Accelerate Greece program, which run from September 30 to October 4 in Toronto.

These innovative companies participated in intensive workshops, received mentorship from industry leaders, and connected with investors to enhance their global growth potential.

This week-long program is designed to empower Greek startups to expand internationally and contribute to the future of Greek innovation.

Financial Achievements and Community Impact

In 2023, THI Canada reached new heights in fundraising, achieving nearly half a million dollars (\$483,395 CAD) in contributions from 184 supporters. This milestone marks our most successful year to date, demonstrating the collective commitment of our members, corporate sponsors, and the wider community to bring meaningful change to Greece.

The funds raised have allowed us to expand our reach and make a tangible impact in multiple areas, from crisis relief and educational initiatives to long-term community development.

Key Fundraising Highlights and Allocations:

Toronto Economic Forum and Fundraising Dinner: Through corporate sponsorships, ticket sales, and an online auction, this event raised \$149,000, exceeding our \$100,000 goal. The net proceeds of \$103,811.86 were directed to both the ELPIDA Foundation, in memory of Marianna V. Vardinoyanni, and THI Canada's core programs, with special focus on launching the 2024-2025 THI Canada Scholarship.

End of Year Appeal - Oli Mazi Collaboration: In a first for our global philanthropic network, THI, THI Australia, and THI Canada came together to support the "With the Gift of Knowledge" initiative, raising \$80,000 for SOS Children's Villages Greece. This funding supports educational resources for disadvantaged children, empowering them to achieve academic success and build a brighter future.

3rd Annual Montreal Cocktail: This event marked our first major social gathering since the pandemic and raised \$120,000, with nearly 200 attendees showing their support. The funds raised will sustain THI Canada's various initiatives for the coming year. We extend special thanks to Anna Antonopoulos and the Antonopoulos family for their exceptional hospitality.

In total, these efforts demonstrate THI Canada's expanded capacity to drive positive change in Greece. Through the power of collaboration, transparency, and strategic allocation of funds, we continue to address urgent needs and create pathways for long-term stability and growth across Greek communities.

And now we add Cyprus in our charitable scope.

The Hellenic Initiative Canada Expands Mission to Support Cyprus with \$100,000 Youth Education Campaign

In October 2024, The Hellenic Initiative Canada (THIC) broadened its mission to include Cyprus, marking a new commitment to Greek and Greek Cypriot communities.

To kick off this expansion, THIC is launching a \$100,000 CAD campaign to support youth education at the Centre for Visual Arts and Research (CVAR) in Nicosia.

Canadian donors, including George Mavroudis, who has pledged to match the first \$50,000, are supporting this vital effort. Tony Lourakis and Gus Constantinou already pledged a total of \$10,000 CAD.

Funds will enhance CVAR's programs, which benefit over 4,000 children annually, deepening their understanding of Cypriot heritage.

All contributions are eligible for tax receipts and will be matched to maximize impact.

Supporting Ecogenia's Youth Climate Initiative

Established in 2021, Ecogenia is a pioneering Greek non-profit organization dedicated to mobilizing young people for accelerated climate action at the local level through the civic service model. Ecogenia is on its way to building the first Climate Corps of its kind in Greece and among the first in Europe, providing opportunities for young people to engage in meaningful climate action.







Supporting Ecogenia's Youth Climate Initiative

Ecogenia's goal is to become a national youth corps, empowering thousands of young Greeks to contribute to climate action and build a resilient Greek society. Our vision is to cultivate a generation of active citizens committed to climate action, working together towards a sustainable and resilient Greece.



We aim to provide every young person aged 18-30 the opportunity to participate in a year of paid service for the climate, leading localized change and addressing community needs across the 13 regions of Greece. Ecogenia is the first nonprofit of its kind in Greece to offer a paid service term for youth that enables them to lead local sustainable development projects and deliver tangible impact, all while receiving professional development and training.

Supporting GivMed

GIVMED | Share medicine Share life was founded in 2016, with the vision of a society where all people enjoy the right to health. GIVMED's mission is to ensure equitable access to medicines and hygiene products through their redistribution and donation, improving the institutional framework, providing educational opportunities and raising awareness in society.



Having created the only digital medicine donation network in Europe, GIVMED meets the needs of 30,000 beneficiaries per month, including people living under the poverty threshold, children, women, elderly, people with disabilities or mental health conditions and refugees. GIVMED has dispensed 1,128,928 boxes of medicines and hygiene products worth €9,671,462, thanks to synergies with 224 charitable organizations, 51 pharmaceutical and health product companies, 24 public health bodies and thousands of individuals.

Emfasis, founded in 2013, supports vulnerable populations in Greece. including families below the poverty line, homeless individuals, unemployed youth, seniors, and single mothers. With ten years of experience mapping needs across 18 municipalities in Attica, **Emfasis** employs social workers. psychologists, and volunteers to provide relief, psychosocial support, and job assistance.

Emfasis is seeking funding for its Family Compass Program, which delivers emergency relief, counseling, and job support for single-parent families at risk of homelessness. The budget \$60,000 will fund key services, staff salaries. and operational costs, impacting over 400 families directly and 3,500+ individuals indirectly across Greece.


Library Support for Dokimi Public School
